Dear Mr. Thonert,

This letter is in response to your letter of January 8, 2020, and is being sent in an effort to resolve our discovery disputes. Enclosed is the letter that we require to be signed by defense counsel before we will provide copies of police reports, etcetera.

Please be advised that in providing discovery, we adhere to the guidelines of Indiana and Allen County, as well as Federal Law, with regard to what needs to be provided. You are not entitled, under current law, to copies of police reports, etcetera, and if the enclosed letter is not signed, you will be provided with a synopsis of the statements of our witnesses. We have the discovery ready and waiting to be picked up at our office, and have had for quite some time.

You have also been advised that you may view the Child Advocacy Center tape, with your client, at our office, during normal business hours. We will not, under any circumstances, provide you with a copy of that tape.

You are the only attorney in Allen County who will not sign our discovery letter. Every other defense attorney has agreed to these terms and discovery is provided, pursuant to our letter. The above has been the longstanding policy of our office, and is in response to several incidents of defense counsel, the defendant, or defense witnesses taking various items of discovery and posting them on social media.

Again, if you are not willing to sign our discovery letter, you will get the names of our witnesses and a synopsis of what they will testify to at trial. You will get copies of any test results, etcetera, if they exist. What you will not get is identifying information on our witnesses and police reports. Again, you will also not receive, under any circumstance, a copy of the CAC tape, but will always be welcome to come view it in our office.

While the defendant reviews the provided discovery, defense counsel or a designated staff person of defense counsel must be present while this material is being reviewed. If the deputy prosecutor consents to the review of discovery by a third party, or if defense counsel retains an expert, said third party, including an expert, agrees that at the conclusion of their services, they must return the provided material to defense counsel and agree not to provide the discovery to any other person. This discovery may not be provided to any successor counsel for the defendant. A signature on the bottom of this document acknowledges receipt of those identified attachments, and an agreement to be bound by these conditions.

Criminal histories (NCICs) are available in our office for viewing by appointment. The State of Indiana, if applicable to this case, intends to offer self authenticating, certified copies of prior convictions and business records.
